RANGER — Frances Worden Freeman, 67, a long-time resident and former schoolteacher of Ranger, died at 12:15 p.m. Saturday at her home. Services will be at 10 a.m. Tuesday at Mesquite and Rusk Streets Church of Christ.

Ronnie Lowe, minister of the church, will officiate. Burial will be at Alameda Cemetery, directed by Edwards Funeral Home in Ranger.

Born March 11, 1916, in Fort Worth, she attended Haskell schools. She received her master's degree in education from Abilene Christian University and moved to Ranger in the 1930s, where she taught elementary school for many years. She married Ben Freeman June 14, 1971, in Harris County. She was a member of Mesquite and Rusk Street Church of Christ, Retired Teachers' Association, New Era Club, American Association of University Women and Delta Kappa Gamma.

Her husband died Dec. 7, 1981.

Survivors include two brothers, Carl Worden of Weatherford and Charlie Worden of Kermit; a sister, Flossie Dietz of Carlton, Ga.; and several nieces and nephews.
