

Sabina man dies in head-on crash

WASHINGTON C.H. — A Sabina man was killed in a head-on crash between a pick-up truck and a car on US 22, just west of Staunton-Jasper Rd., at 12:12 a.m. Sunday.

Archie L. Tudor, 35, of Sabina Mobile Home Park and Sales, lot 14, was pronounced dead-on-arrival at Fayette Memorial Hospital, the Fayette County Sheriff's office said.

Charles F. Willet, 38, of South Lebanon, driver of a pick-up truck which deputies say collided with Tudor's car, was taken to University Hospital, Columbus. Hospital officials say he is in satisfactory condition in the intensive care unit.

Both vehicles were total losses, deputies said.

Mr. Tudor's wife Brenda Crouch Tudor, survives.

He was born Oct. 27, 1938 at Paris, Tex., the son of William Edward and Nell Faye Tudor. He was a member of the Sabina Moose and Washington C. H. Elks. A Sabina resident for two and one-half years, he was a Navy veteran and a general foreman for ConChemco, Sabina.

Surviving in addition to his wife are his mother Mrs. Nell Faye Hart of Chandler, Tex.; three children, Teena, Tony and Gina, all at home; three sisters, Mrs. Colleen Wright, Mrs. Delores Blackstock and Mrs. Bernell Slaton, all of Dallas, Tex.; and a half-brother David Larry Hart of Scott City, Kas.

Services will be 4 p.m. today at Littleton funeral home, Sabina with the Rev. Joseph Lorimor officiating. Calling hours are 3 to 8 p.m. today at the funeral home. Burial will be at Ranger, Tex.
