CHANEY COMMUNITY — Bernard D. "Ike" Yancey, 68, died Friday at a Ranger hospital.

Services will be at 4 p.m. Sunday at the Daugherty Street Church of Christ in Eastland with Gary Montgomery officiating. Burial will be in the Alameda Cemetery, directed by Edwards Funeral Home of Eastland.

Born in Daisy, Okla., he was a longtime resident of the Chaney community and attended Alameda school.
