RANGER — Alice (Mrs. W.E.) Calvert, 95, who owned and operated the restaurant at the Ranger Sale Barn for many years, died Friday in an Eastland hospital.

Services will be at 2 p.m. Tuesday in the Mesquite and Rusk Streets Church of Christ with Ronnie Lowe and Jim Hall officiating. Burial will be in Alameda Cemetery south of Ranger, directed by Edwards Funeral Home.

Mrs. Calvert was born in the Alameda Community where she attended school. She worked as a cook at the Porky Pig Restaurant, and for Social Science, making map books for schools. She was a member of the Home Extension Club Royal Neighbors, Breakfast Club and Order of the Eastern Star. She also was a member of the Mesquite & Rusk St. Church of Christ and was the widow of W. E. Calvert, whom she married in 1915 in Alameda.

Survivors include two sons, Gerald H. Calvert and James O. Calvert, both of Fort Worth; one daughter, Marjory Faye Lamb of Ranger; five grandchildren; 10 great-grandchildren; and three great-great-grandchildren.
