

Ex-Owner of ABCO Dies at 69

Homer Jay Nash, 69, retired owner-operator of ABCO Industries, Inc., here, was dead on arrival at Hendrick Memorial Hospital at 10:35 p.m. Sunday after an apparent heart attack at his home, 234 Sayles.

Funeral will be held at 10 a.m. Tuesday in Kiker-Warren Funeral Chapel with Dr. James Flammig, pastor of First Baptist Church, officiating.

Graveside rites will be held at 12:30 p.m. Tuesday in Alameda Cemetery in Eastland County.

Born Sept. 10, 1897, in Desdemona, he married Mittie E Warford, Feb. 3, 1924, in Breckenridge.

Before coming here, he was superintendent of gasoline refineries for Ohio Oil Co. and T.P. Coal and Oil Co., and was superintendent of plant maintenance for the Monsanto Chemical Co. plant in Texas City.

He was owner of ABCO Industries, Inc., from 1945 until retirement in 1960.

He was a member of First Baptist Church.
