

Mrs. Strickler of Ranger Dies

RANGER (RNS) - Mrs. Sirrener Leola Strickler, 93, died at 10 pm. Friday at Westerner Manor Nursing Home in Ranger.

Funeral will be held Sunday at 3 p.m. in the Church of Christ here located at the corner of Mesquite and Rusk Streets Church of Christ with Gary Beauchamp, minister, officiating. Burial will be in Alameda Cemetery, Killingsworth Funeral Home in charge.
